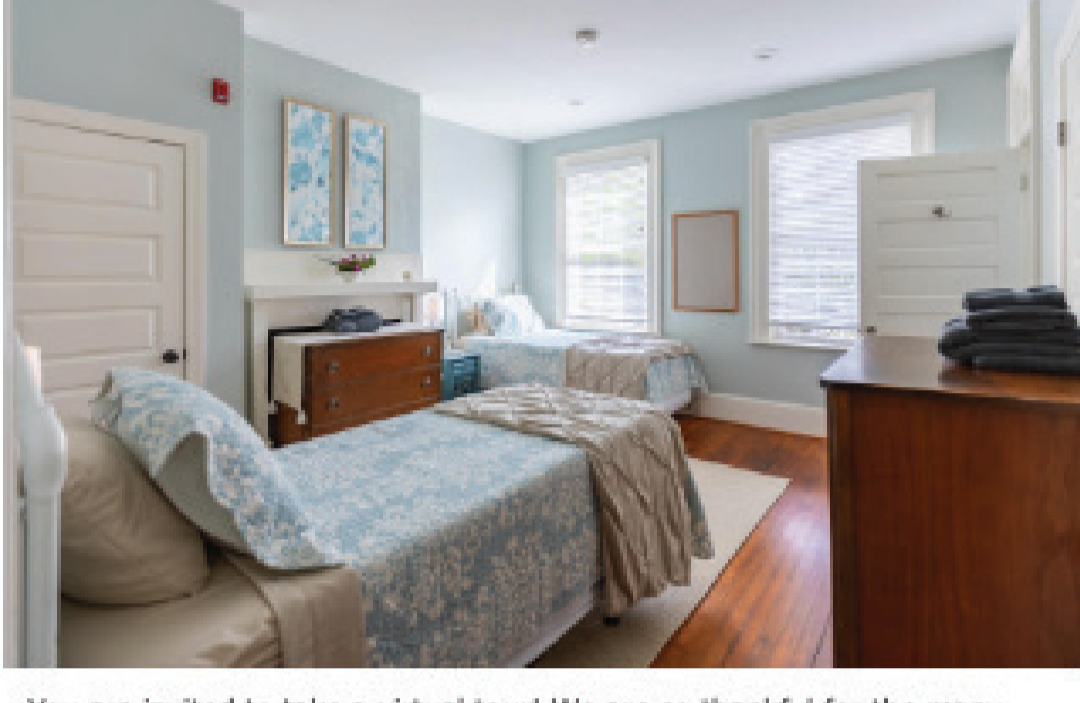

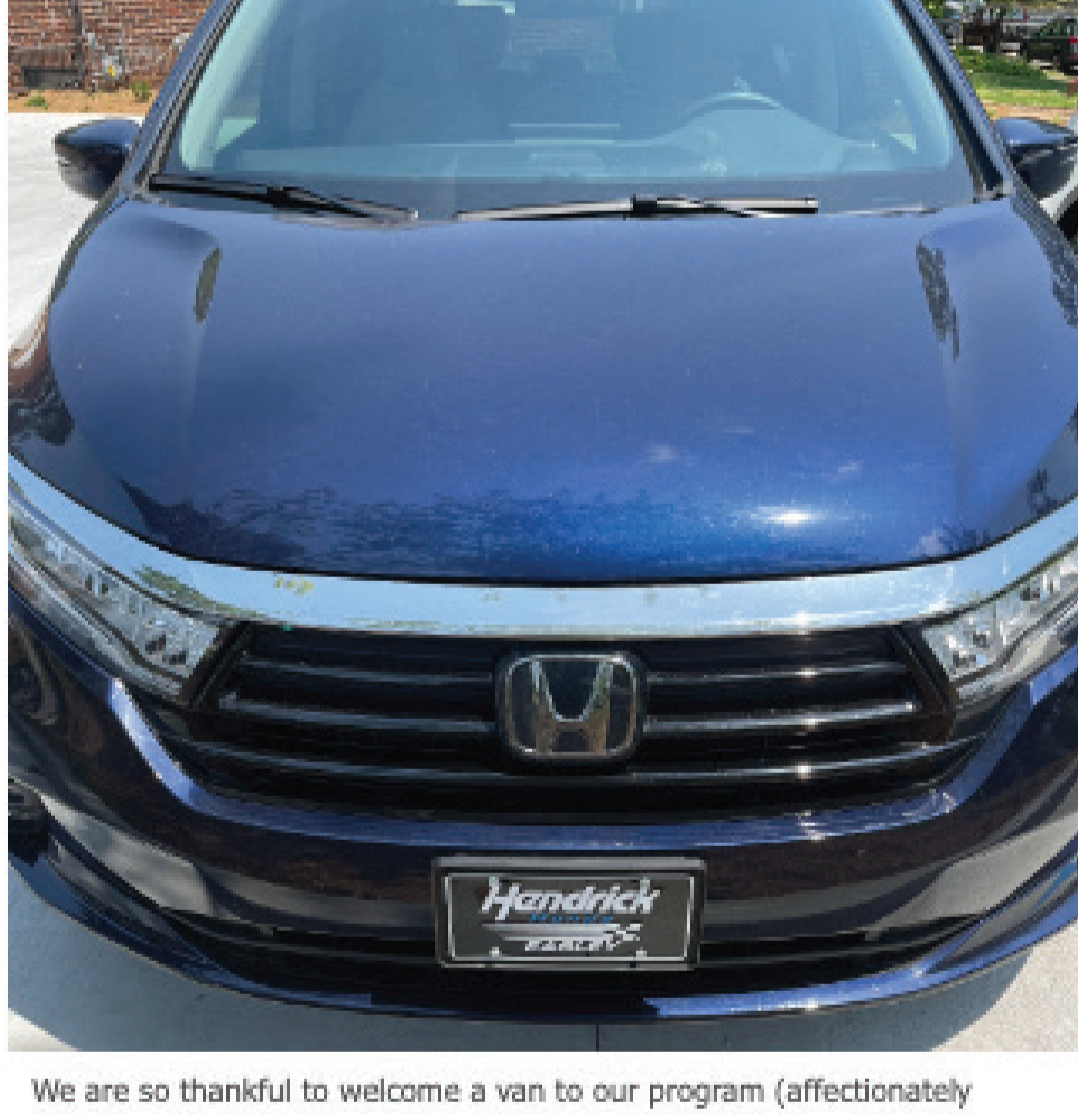
Who's on the Move: Residential program for SC human trafficking survivors opens second safe home in partnership with Upstate Faith Community

Bon Secours announced in a press release the expansion of the first long-term residential restoration program for human trafficking survivors in South Carolina. The addition triples Jasmine Road's capacity from 5 to 15 beds, allowing the organization to serve more female survivors who desperately need a program with comprehensive services.
