The Jasmine at our Jasmine Road home is in full bloom. The bulbs that were planted last year in the cool of the fall are beginning to push their way through the soil. And, so goes the story of our residents who are image bearers of life, determination and beauty. They are awaking from the dead of their winter and beginning to come alive again. It is truly beautiful to witness the healing and restoration of the women unfolding in front of you.

On one winter day a few months ago, during the cold and pouring rain, I overheard a conversation. "I sure am thankful I am not still out on the streets wandering around in that mess today." Words of gratitude yet uttered soberly by one of our Jasmine Road residents. Sobering,

not just because this was her past reality, but also because she has friends still out there, wandering the streets, looking for those very things she has now found; security, safety, a place to rest and maybe, most of all, love and community. Such is the continual plight of our homeless neighbors, right here in our own Greenville who are wandering and looking for someone to notice and to care. As I reflect on our Jasmine Road journey of almost a year after opening our first home, I am grateful that our

residents have found sanctuary- a shelter from their individual storms. I am also grateful for the work of our partners in our community such as Triune Mercy Center who work tirelessly every day, giving hope and assistance to those on our streets. Together we will welcome even more women from the dead of their winter on the streets and home to the spring of a new life of hope and possibilities. As always, our seasons will continuously change yet our residents bear witness to the courage needed to weather even the toughest of storms. I leave you with this quote from Pablo Neruda

"you can cut all the flowers, but you cannot keep the Spring from coming". Spring is



Partner Spotlight: Triune Mercy Center

Under the leadership of Pastor Deb Richardson-Moore for the past 13 1/2 years, Triune has become a vibrant community that provides much more than food and clothing to the homeless and poor who make up about half of the congregation. The various weekday ministries offer hope and a sense of belonging to those who suffer from addiction, mental illness, unemployment, poverty and loneliness. As one of the founding partner organizations, Triune was instrumental in establishing the Jasmine Road program which is based on surrounding people with a loving supportive network and allowing them time and space to heal from trauma and life on the streets of Greenville. "We knew we weren't reaching women as we wanted to," said Richardson-

We believe it's a partnership made in heaven, quite literally." Staff, mentors and volunteers interact daily with the women in a true spirit of kinship.
